Church Family,

It's the week of Christmas. For many it's the most special time of year. Merry Christmas to you and your family. I hope you have a wonderful, memorable, and symptom-free Christmas.

With COVID cases on the rise in Jeff Davis County, I've been thinking more (for the second time this year) about what it means to go to church. This year our church has had to start asking new types of questions. For instance, is watching an online service a sufficient option when you could be going in-person instead. Does it make a difference if you watch the online service live or if you just make a point to catch up later? Should you stop what you're doing and only focus on the online service or can you just sort of let it play in the background? These sorts of questions abound.

I've got my opinions about most of these issues, but opinions aren't worth too much. Biblical doctrine is much more valuable than one's opinion. The Bible teaches what we call the doctrine of the Lord's Day. The Lord's Day is the first day of the week—i.e., Sunday. It's the day of the week that Jesus rose from the dead (Mark 16:9). It's also the day of the week that early Christians met for worship, for observance of the Lord's Supper, and for the collection of offerings to help the church's ministries (Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:2).

The Lord's Day is important and it happens every single week, and we neglect it to our own peril (Heb. 10:25). One day out of every seven we have the opportunity to commemorate Christ's resurrection and devote ourselves to worship, fellowship, service, and other spiritual activities. We're all trying to do our best when it comes to this year of COVID and being an active and engaged member of our church family. Let me encourage you to honor the Lord's Day. Seek the Lord prayerfully. Attend to him whole-heartedly. Be wise and be obedient. Trust God, be honest with yourself, and let your heart be tuned to the chords of Holy Scripture and the genuine Christian conscience.
